It was so good to see nearly 1,500 guests and volunteers having a wonderful time in Guildhall for the 2022 Lunch, after the two years when Covid 19 prevented us from gathering in that historic setting.

The atmosphere was terrific. The Livery stalls were heaped with good things to buy. Our band of authors were kept busy signing their latest books.

The Champagne Bars did a roaring trade as everyone tucked into delicious Pol Roger champagne and hoped to win Susannah Lovis's fabulous diamond and gold pendant.

Similarly the Cocktails Bars, where two far-too-easy to drink cocktails, designed by the Lord Mayor and the Lady Mayoress and mixed by the expert team from the Coq d'Argent Restaurant, offered a chance to win a Pinchbeck bespoke British-made watch.

Then followed three lunch sittings, with an array of delicious curries from Noon Foods, backed by specially-selected wines from Private Cellar and lots of that smooth Cobra beer. There was excellent music, much of it with a Royal connection, from a Royal Marines Band in the Great Hall and from three young musicians who were prize winners from the Musicians Company in the Livery Hall and East Crypt.

All of us marking the extraordinary service and dedication of Her Majesty The Queen in her Platinum Jubilee Year.

How lovely it was to have two of Her Majesty's grandchildren with us, the Princesses Beatrice and Eugenie, who spent time talking with veterans that we have supported and their families. Their Royal Highnesses really enjoyed the occasion and went home with some lovely gifts from the Livery Companies for their children.
